


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

3. TOOLS AND MATERIALS REQUIRED

Cutting Knife - Use to open Kits, and trim Buffer Strip to size.



Measuring Rule - Use to check dimensions and distances of cross-hars



Cleaning/protective Cloth - Use to wipe down vehicle, and use to protect vehicle paint.



Marking Pencil -Use to mark buffer strip.




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Strip to size. of cross-bars. to protect vehicle paint. Use to mark buffer strip. Bars.

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4. INSTALLATION STEPS

Prior to Assembly, check that your Roof Rack Box contains all the parts as listed above. Ensure the vehicle roof is clean and dry. Use Knife to cut through the packaging polybags.

STEP 1

On the vehicle roof there are 4 concealed Anchor Points hidden by the vehicles weather strips. The two locations are indicated by the distances in Fig 1a. Measure the approximate distances as per Fig 1a from the start of the weather strip.

Carefully lift the weather strip to reveal location marks as seen in (Fig. 1b). Using these locations, mark the centre of the location mark on the weather strip. This centre line is the location of the anchor point in the vehicle roof.

NOTE: For single bar fitment use either front or rear anchor points as seen in Fig 1a.


NOTE: The anchor point is concealed from veiw by a sealant.

∧ NOTE: Take care when lifting vehicle weather strip to avoid damaging the roof of the vehicle.

Either cut a small 20mm section OR drill the weather strip in the marked location to expose the anchor point. Drill using a 13mm drill bit.

NOTE: If using a drill, ensure a drill stop is used to avoid damage to vehicle roof

To reveal anchor point, remove covering sealant with sharp tool. It is recommended that once covering sealant is removed, thread each anchor point with M8 bolt supplied to ensure a clean thread.



STEP 2

Select an Anchor Point from STEP 1 and with one of the supplied Rubber Gaskets place them over the top of the anchor point as per Fig. 2a.

↑ Ensure the Rubber Gasket is oriented correctly, (part number to outer edge of vehicle). (Fig. 2a).


The Ensure that the center hole in the gasket lines up with the anchor point thread in the roof.

Locate the Plastic Multi Pad onto the Rubber Gasket

Ensure the Multi Pad is oriented correctly (Fig. 2b).

The Ensure that the center hole in the Multi Pad lines up with the anchor point thread in the roof.

Repeat for all remaining Adaptors.



STEP 3

Place an end support onto the adaptor from STEP 2, and loosely secure it down with a 70mm bolt by inserting the bolt into the anchor hole, and turning approximately 2-3 turns with the security key (Refer to Fig. 3). Do not tighten yet. Repeat for the opposite side.







STEP 4

Place the crossbar onto the end supports ensuring that the end supports are located into the cutouts on the underside of the crossbar. (Fig. 4)

Check that the cross bar has equally distanced overhang on either side from the end support.

STEP 5

Insert the M8 nut into the cavity on the Commercial Slug. (Fig. 5)

Insert the Commercial Slug into the cross tube, and align it so that the M8 nut in the Commercial Slug and the hole at the bottom of the end support line up.


Secure the cross bar to the end support by screwing the M8x20mm bolt through the hole in the end support and up into the nut that is located in the cavity of the Commerical Slug nut.

Using a 13mm Spanner, fully tighten the 20mm bolt on the underside of the end support.

Tighten all M8 bolts to 6-7 Nm

Repeat Step 6-7 for remaining crossbar.

Refer to fitting instruction 424 for insertion of the under-cover strip.




STEP 8

Pull back the buffer strip to allow access to the end of the cross-bar.


Insert Endcap into the Cross-bar by locating the two 'feet' of the Endcap into the void inside the cross-bar. (Fig 8)

Push through until End-cap edge comes to rest against the edge of the cross-bar. This is important as the Locking Actuator inside the Endcap has to locate within the Locking slot on the end of the cross-bar.



STEP 9

Pull back the buffer strip to allow access to the end of the cross-bar.



STEP 10

You are now ready to mount your accessories, eg. Bike Carrier, Kayak carrier, etc. utilising the "Global Channel" if applicable. (Fig. 9).

Place the accessory onto the buffer strip in the location where it will be mounted in relation to your cross-bars. Using a marking and measuring tool, ie. pencil/tape measure - make your mark onto the rubber buffer strips.

Next, completely remove the buffer strip from its channel within the cross-bars and cut out the portion using heavy duty scissors/shears.

NOTE: DO NOT dispose of this rubber strip but store it in a secure place to be re-mounted once the accessory has been removed from the rack. This will help reduce wind noise during travel.

USAGE INSTRUCTIONS

It is essential for the proper assembly, operation and use of the Roof-rack that the instructions and safety precautions supplied are strictly observed. The Maximum permissible load for your Roof Bar is the lower of the maximum load capacity specified in you vehicle operation manual, or specified as applying to the Roof-rack. Do not exceed the maximum specified Load capacity.

 $\label{eq:maximum Permissible Load} \textbf{Maximum Permissible Load} = \textbf{Weight of the Roof-rack} + \textbf{Weight of Accessories} + \textbf{Weight of Load} (\textbf{Cargo}).$

When fitting the Roof-rack and transporting a load, ensure the vehicle's functions are not impaired (e.g. sunroof, aerials, windscreen wipers, mirrors). Rear doors on Hatch - and wagon-type vehicles should be inspected for adequate clearance for full opening operation of the boot/tailgate.

Stop and check all screw connections, bolts and retaining straps after a short distance of travel. Repeat these checks at regular intervals.

WARNINGS

Remember that the fitting of a Roof-rack and the transport of a load increases the overall height of the carrying vehicle.

Where the roof-rack is to be used in off-road conditions, a safety weight reduction of 1.5 should be observed from the total carrying capacity (eg. 60kg becomes 40kg).
